The Eye of the Tiger

Running the formation race and (hopefully) winning.

Dear Holy Trinity,

St. Paul, writing to his friend and mentee Timothy near the end of his ministry, offers a warning and a promise:

> I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. (1 Timothy 4:1b-4)

We live in a time where truth and myth are seemingly indecipherable. "Fake News" and dummy social media accounts spread false information, rally people around false narratives and causes, and sow deceit and enmity between neighbors, family, and friends. We have a natural tendency to surround ourselves with people who think like us and that creates

an echo chamber. As the famous Manhattan socialite and film critic Pauline Kael reportedly said in response to Nixon's presidential victory in 1972, "Everyone I know voted for McGovern." This is the echo chamber. 2018 is no different.

What is the solution for a world gone mad? What is the solution for Fake News and false stories? How do we once again find "sound doctrine" and "patient teaching?"

I think the answer is *Rocky III*.

It's the eye of the tiger, it's the thrill of the fight. / Risin' up to the challenge of our rival. / And the last known survivor stalks his prev in the night / And he's watchin' us all with the eye of the tiger.

You might remember this famous scene from *Rocky III*, as the titular Rocky prepares for his fight with Mr. T (I mean Clubber Lang.) Survivor's 1982 classic "Eye of the Tiger"—Stallone's second choice for the soundtrack after Oueen refused to let him use "Another One Bites the Dust"-gives us a way forward for dealing with a fake news world.

We must fight! We must rise up! We must stalk our prey at night and wait to pounce! We must have the eyes of the tiger.

But what does that really look like? For St. Paul, it looked a lot like Rockv:

I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. (1 Timothy 4:7)

To respond to a world of evanescent truth we must train and prepare, like the famous scene in *Rocky III*. It will not be as physically grueling as preparing for a boxing matching, but it might be emotionally and spiritually exhausting: revealing our true selves, our total dependence on God, and our utter need for a savior. But it will also be invigorating, life-giving, and (hopefully) fun.

This Fall we are committing ourselves to preparing for the race of which Paul speaks; getting our doctrine and understanding in right order through patient (and entertaining) teaching. *This fall, we are focusing on formation.*

Because the truth is—your life can not be transformed by the story of Jesus if you don't know the story in the first place.

Starting in the first week of September, we will offer various formation opportunities for Holy Trinity folks (and friends) to learn, grow, and study together. From the Bible to faith, from confirmation to membership, we are committed to finding ways to include everyone in these formation opportunities, and to collectively form a solid base of faith instruction with which to build the future. We hope there is something for everyone. A few of our offerings include:

A Complete Idiot's Guide to the Prayer Book (Sun. at 9 AM)

This Adult Sunday School series will be a fun and interesting way to engage with and learn about *The Book of Common Prayer*. Our shared liturgical life is grounded in and based on the BCP, so it's helpful to know what's it in. Come to this class and see for yourself. You'll surprised how much the Bible quotes the BCP. *Starts Sunday, Sept. 16.*

Sparkhouse Lectionary Class

(Sun. at 9 AM)

The Children's Sunday School curriculaum is based on each Sunday's lectionary readings and helps the children go in-depth on the Gospel story. Created by Augsburg Fortress, this curriculum has been created by the best teachers, biblical scholars, and child development specialists, to help our kids connect in deeper ways with Scripture and the story of Christ. *Starts Sun, Sept. 16.*

Newcomers Class (Sun. at 12 PM)

Are you new to Holy Trinity, the Episcopal Church, or faith in general? Well this three-week class is a crash course in what it means to be an Episcopal Christian in this church. Open to everyone, we'll get to know each other better, dive into the things that make us Christians, and get introduced to this parish. The class ends with a Newcomers Party in October. We will host another Newcomers Class in 2019. Class begins Sept. 23; continues Sept. 30 and Oct. 7.

Rector's Bible Study: Genesis (Pt. 2) (Wed. at 10:15 AM)

We continue our deep readings of Genesis. From day one, we have run into every culturally and socially relevant topic imaginable. Genesis might seem like a distant fairy tale, but it has very real things to tell us about people, the world, and the God who loves both.

Starts Wed., Sept. 12.

Alpha (Thurs. at 6:30 PM)

Coming out of the Church of England, *Alpha* is a short course in Christian basics. Beginning with the question "Is there more to life?" *Alpha* takes its members on an 11-week journey into Christian basics. This is a small group, and space is limited; however, if you are interested please contact me for details about the group. We will be hosting another *Alpha* course in 2019.

Starts Thurs, Sept. 6 at the rectory.

THE PERFECT GIFT

There is something special about gifts. Whether they are big or small, deeply meaningful or a matter of social expectation, gifts have an incredible way of changing our thinking, our mood, and our lives.

I think it's safe to assume that everyone has received a gift. I bet it's even safe to assume that you received a memorable gift. In fact, I bet that if I asked you about that gift, you could tell me every detail of it, every tiny fact about the day you received it, and the personal story and biography of the giver.

If you were to ask me, you'd be regaled with the story of the first *Mighty Morphin' Power Rangers* Megazord from 1995. Sold out everywhere, my brother and I never expected to receive one on Christmas morning—not Santa, or our parents, or even our grand-parents could pull off that miracle. As we sat by the Christmas tree, and the presents dwindled, the reality set it: it was not happening. But then our dad got up and left the room, and came back with a huge wrapped present. We tore into it and low and behold it was the Megazord, shipped in special from central Pennsylvania from a little-known mall near my grandparents.

Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father.

James 1:17a

The shock, the surprise, the joy, and the love. That's what I remember from receiving that gift. We knew that our parents and grandparents had scoured and planned and put in a ton of effort just to give us this present—this joy.

For us, it was the perfect gift.

THE GIFTS OF 2018

As we look toward 2019, we remember and celebrate the gifts that were given in the last year. The extra money given to support our youth ministry. The grant received to build the rectory fence. The weekly and monthly pledges, given faithfully by over 60 families to support the ministry and mission of Holy Trinity.

Those pledges—those gifts—have done more than keep the lights on. They have welcomed over 15 new people into Holy Trinity. They have taught the youth group about food scarcity and poverty in the developing world. They have purchased new, updated curricula for Sunday School. And they have helped us expand our outreach initiatives with a new copy machine and updated our outreach materials.

Even more than that, in 2018 Holy Trinity received the largest individual gift it has ever received from the estate of Lee Rodriguez. In making his final arrangements, Lee left us his home, and gifted us over \$50,000 dollars. This gift stands as a testament to Lee's faith and love for this parish, but also as a symbol of what a "perfect gift" looks like.

A perfect gift which will not only support the church now, but will support the church for years to come. It is an investment in, and testament to, the faith we have that Holy Trinity will continue to shape and form the lives of the people who come here. These gifts are made from a place of sacrificial love for the betterment of ourselves, our neighbors, and the world.

PERFECT GIFTS FOR 2019

St. James reminds us that every perfect gift—and every generous act of giving—is really a transfer. We are transferring the gifts we have received from God to others. Every perfect gift is itself a gift from the Father.

Therefore, in giving back, we are reminded to remember God and the church in our acts of generosity. The historic gift to God has been the "tithe" or 10 percent of one's income. The Old Testament refers to this as the "first fruits:" the very first 10 percent of what is earned is given back to God as a reminder that every perfect gift comes from him.

The average pledge at Holy Trinity is \$2,150 a year or about \$40 a week. If we increased giving by 2.5%, to about \$50 a week and \$2700 a year, we would have another \$34,000 for the ministry and mission of Holy Trinity!

As we begin praying and talking about our giving for the coming year, I invite you—and challenge you—to remember a perfect gift you have received. Remember what that feels like as you prayerfully consider making your pledge to Holy Trinity. And remember that all things come from God, through him all blessings flow.

You will receive your stewardship letter and pledge cards in the mail by September 24. Please return them to Holy Trinity, either by mail or in the offering plate, by October 21. And be sure to mark your calendars for our annual Consecration Sunday on October 28. We will have one, combined service at 9 AM and the Canon for Congregation Development for the Diocese of New Jersey, the Rev. Cn. Rob Droste will be our guest preacher. Be sure to RSVP for this wonderful celebration of God's gifts for Holy Trinity.



WEDNESDAY EUCHARIST 11:30 AM All Saints Chapel


